KILHAM PARISH COUNCIL NEWS & TRANSPORT SURVEY

At the Annual Parish Meeting Geoff Seward was again nominated as Chairman and Mark Buckle as Vice-Chairman, both accepted their positions. Being a new session, all our councillors re-applied and were successful, along with John Girling. Along with the newsletter you will have received a questionnaire. Some of you may remember the Kilham Public Transport Survey held in February. This was a rushed affair because at the time we believed the service was about to disappear altogether without urgent action. The feedback from this survey was very small, too small we are told to result in any changes for the better.

Could we ask that you take five minutes of your time to complete the form and return it to the shop please, before the 30th June. The questionnaire is to find out what as a village you require from your bus provider, or not as the case may be. As a Parish Council we are working closely with ERYC to try and improve the current bus service, we need to know whether you use the buses, if you feel the timetable suits your needs, would you use the service if the time table was changed or simply whether you would never use the bus. Like most rural services our bus service could be under threat and in it's current form we feel that it is not serving our community. To have the best chance in negotiating a new time table we need to produce evidence. Please take a couple of minutes to complete the form and thank you for your time. Also please contact Denise Hayhurst on 01262 420013 if you are unable to return your completed survey to the shop and somebody will come and pick it up for you. Please remember this is a service vital to a village and the more responses we get the better our chances of keeping the service going.

On a lighter note the Parish Council were successful in winning a grant from Lissett Community Wind Farm Fund, to design and have built a new Information Board for the village , we are hoping to start work on this within the next couple of months.

The Women's Institute (WI) was formed in 1915 to revitalise rural communities and encourage women to become more involved in producing food during the First World War. Since then the organisation's aims have broadened and the WI is now the largest voluntary women's organisation in the UK. The WI will celebrate its centenary in 2015 and currently has 212,000 members in around 6,600 WIs.

The WI plays a unique role in providing women with educational opportunities and the chance to build new skills, to take part in a wide variety of activities and to campaign on issues that matter to them and their communities.

Kilham WI started in 1928 and still meets the second Tuesday of every month (except August) in the Village Hall at 7.15pm. Apart from the meetings when there are guest speakers on a mixture of topics, we also have a walking group and a social outing every month.

For example in March we were entertained by Reena Scrowston telling us how to survive increasing maturity. This was a highly entertaining talk and kept us laughing throughout the evening. The following month we had a demonstration by Helen Dry who showed us the amazing cakes she had created and allowed us to try our hands at making our own figure out of fondant icing - the results were interesting to say the least. Our speaker in May was Hazel Armstrong who told us about The **Associated Country Women of the World** (ACWW) which works in partnership with its members, offering mutual support, friendship and practical help to women and communities around the world. The talk was informative and amusing but also made us realise how lucky we are to live in a society that takes things like women's rights, education and even electricity for granted.

The walking group visits locations in both town and countryside including lately Beverley, Sewerby and Foston on the Wolds. All usually end with a pub lunch or tea and cake!

Social outings too are varied - a visit to the cinema, a snowdrop walk and a very indulgent afternoon tea to name but a few.

There are also opportunities to have a go at gliding or archery. A Puffin Cruise to Bempton Cliffs has been arranged and next month, two of our members are going to a Buckingham Palace Garden Party.

We are not "cliquey" and most definitely not "old" so why not come to a meeting and see for yourself. You would be made most welcome.
