Are you a keen gardener? we currently have a vacant allotment, the annual rent is £25, again contact the Clerk if you require further information.

Currently there are two East Riding funds available to the public to improve your home security. The Lissett Wind Farm fund is for the elderly/ vulnerable within the village. If you feel your home security could be improved please contact the clerk for a referral form. This fund has been running for five months and the Parish council has received good feedback from residents who have taken advantage of the service. East Riding have also launched another grant, again to improve home security, to be eligible you must be over 60 or disabled, in receipt of means tested benefit or a homeowner or private sector tenant/ Housing Association tenant.
