7:30pm, Thursday nights, in The Old Star.



Dear all,

The countdown to Christmas is well underway and plenty happening in the village and at church to get us ready for Christmas. This year Christmas day falls on a Sunday: it's the seven yearly Jackpot for vicars! (no additional Sunday services).

To get us started on Thursday 8th December the church will host, 'A concert for Christmas' with 'Ray's Voices' and other acts; It sounds a fun and entertainment packed

evening (details elsewhere in the newsletter on that). On the following Sunday (11th December at 6.30) there will be 'A Night of Miracles' performed by 'The Ad Hoc singers'. This promises to be a class act and is essentially a sequence of readings and Advent/Christmas music. The centrepiece is "Night of Miracles" by the contemporary American composer John Peterson. Lasting around 40 minutes, this continuous piece tells the Christmas story through a mixture of music and spoken words.

It's a wonderful and dramatic way of entering into the Christmas story. Both of these events will raise money for worthy charities; Hemophilia Association and Shelter, respectively.

We will have the school Nativity and Carol service on Thursday 17th December and the children will bring their usual joy and energy. Christmas Eve will be a big night for us too. At 5pm we have our 'Crib-tingle service'; a mixture of dressing the crib with the usual characters, singing and giving everyone a Christingle as symbol of joy, light and peace. When all the Children are fast asleep we'll have our midnight Holy Communion. The finale of our celebrations and the most poignant reminder of the central Christian truth of: 'the word made flesh and dwelling among us' (John 1.14)

NAFFERTON SURGERY MEDICATION COLLECTION

It is with regret that despite our protestations we have been informed by the Park Surgery Driffield that the delivery service from Nafferton Dispensary to Kilham Village Store will be suspended from 12th December following an inspection into the control of medications at their local dispensaries. It would appear that the system, whereby the weekly collection made by a small team of parish councillors, have for the past three years been undertaken without any problems having been experienced, does not comply with the current regulations. The surgery have stressed that they hope this suspension will only be of a temporary nature but can make no promises that a viable alternative will be found which would enable them to re-instate this valuable service.

However we are well aware that a small number of village residents may have serious concerns regarding collection of their medication particularly at this time of the year, in such circumstances please contact any member of the parish council to discuss possible temporary alternatives that may still be available.

Kilham Neighbourhood Watch

Unfortunately, one of our residents homes was broken into recently and a lot of their valuables stolen. Please everybody be aware, especially with the dark evenings that we must make sure all our windows and doors, garages and outbuildings are securely locked up. Also remember over this Christmas period to keep an eye on neighbours homes if we know they are away. There have been several poaching incidents reported, so please be on the look out for any suspicious activity

KILHAM PLAYING FIELDS ASSOCIATION

Our final event of the year was the village bonfire and fireworks display. I hope you all enjoyed it as much as we did. The good weather gave perfect conditions for the firework display which lit up the sky in an amazing display organised by Ronnie Tate and John Young. The food tent this year was manned by volunteers from the school who I believe raised £400 for their funds. As usual the helpers on the day made the event possible, so a big thank

you to Dave Stork, Richard Baker, Ian Pick, Steve Scott, Marie Sheader, Rachel & Gary Edeson and Henri Williams.

The All Weather Court is finally finished after all the years of fund raising, so hopefully you will all see where your money has been going. The court can be used by all, with tennis, football and basketball nets built into the facilities. In the future you will be able to book the court if you are a local organisation or linked to the playing field, at certain times of the week for a small donation. The final costs for the Tarmac, Line marking and Fencing have been £34,000, for which KPFA have raised £25,500 with the remainder coming from a Lissett Wind Farm grant award. This has been the biggest single project we have taken on and will be the last undertaken by the current KPFA Team.

The KPFA team have decided that it is now time to step aside and let a new team run the field going forward. The All Weather court was the final piece in the development plan we had laid down and now it is completed brings the opportunity for a new team to take KPFA forward.

I would like to thank all who have helped directly on the committee or volunteered over the years for the Bike Ride, Sponsored Walks, Rag & Bone, Bonfires and Beer Festivals, which has made the whole Playing Field possible. We estimate we have spent close to £140,000 on facilities and machinery linked to the playing field, without any consideration to general running costs.

Elizabeth Knowsley - Charity

Elizabeth Knowsley was the daughter of John and Elizabeth Outram. She was born in Burton Agnes in September 1766 and the family later moved to Kilham. They were a well to do family and there is a plaque to the Outrams in Kilham church. Elizabeth married Robert Knowsley, gentleman of Cottam, in Kilham on 14 August 1787. Unusually for that time Elizabeth had money of her own - £1400. She made her will in 1798 and made a bequest of £50 in a trust, the income of which to be distributed by the Overseers and Church Wardens of Kilham, to the poor persons of the parish. At the time this was a large sum of money but by 1980 when the last distribution was made the income was £2.82 and was shared between 3 persons at 94p each. Until now the charity has been dormant and upon closure produced a sum of £69.27 which was given to Driffield Food Bank in keeping with the original aim of the bequest.

Elizabeth died on 14 December 1800 and is buried in a vault on the East of the Chancel door of Langtoft church.

A stone in the aisle of Kilham Church (now covered by carpet) states - That Elizabeth, the wife of Robert Knowsley of Cottam Esq. left by will to Marmaduke Prickett of Bridlington, Attorney at Law the sum of fifty pounds, in trust for the Poor of Kilham the interest thereof (whatever it may be) the said Marmaduke Prickett, his heirs and Assigns, are to pay on 14th December annually for ever to the Churchwardens and Overseers of Kilham to be by them distributed to the poor. With the above bequest Mr Prickett in the year 1803 bought £85.1.8 in the three percent reduced annuities which stock yields an annual dividend of £2.11.0.

D'Arcy Exhibition

At a recent presentation by the trustees of the D'Arcy Exhibition, Kilham School received £1,850 after the charity was wound up. The school intends spending the money on books for the library so that children throughout the school, both present and future, will benefit from the fund.



The Free School in Kilham was founded in September 1634 by John Lord D'Arcy and the charity was originally established as the D'Arcy's Free School Endowment under a scheme approved by the Charity Commissioners dated 9th November 1883 To allow for payment of fees in the form of scholarships for pupils from elementary schools in Kilham. There is a board in the entrance hall of the school showing the recipients of the scholarship.

Following the 1944 Education Act, which gave free secondary educa-

tion to all, such endowments were no longer necessary and the fund became dormant. In October 1979 a new scheme was started to provide grants to help Kilham students in further education buy books etc. By 2000 the scheme had again become dormant and the capital was such that the income produced was minimal. The decision was made to wind up the charity and trustees were appointed to oversee the closure.
