There have been one or two incidents that are not acceptable, it seems that the playing areas and the tennis courts on Back Lane are being used as a meeting place for youngsters who are parking up, drinking and there may be a possibility that drugs are involved and leaving their rubbish lying around. There has also been an incident of the portacabin being broken into.

The Playing Field Association and the Neighbourhood Watch are not going to tolerate this behaviour – so if you happen to be taking a stroll in the vicinity of Back Lane and you see something that looks out of context, please get in touch with Anita or the police. As villagers have contributed to a place to be used for everyone to enjoy, we will not tolerate someone doing damage to that area.

Another note of harassment, the Old Post Office House has been egged one night during the last week and the occupant's car had the same treatment. Why would anyone in their right minds want to do a stupid act like that? I hope that CCTV footage will be seen and the person who is responsible be made to pay for the damage caused.

Please be aware of scams still targeting old people who live alone – **don't give any bank details to anyone who rings or asks for them**. We have had another incident last week to a lady who lives in the village.

Please try to keep shed doors and garage doors closed during the day even if you are in, there are sneak thieves always on the lookout for something to steal.

## Fracking and the Planning System for Communities

RTPI and Planning Aid England, have recently published a step-by-step document clearly explaining the planning process for shale gas extraction, or as it is more commonly known, fracking.

The aim is to ensure that communities, councillors and other interested parties are correctly informed of this emotive and controversial subject.

#### It covers:

- how shale gas is extracted
- how applications are assessed and determined through the planning process

the role of other (not planning) regulatory bodies

how to advise communities affected by shale gas extraction proposals (advice for Planning Aid England volunteers)

# The advice only applies to England, as it is the only part of the UK where shale gas extraction is currently permitted.




