Keep Britain Tidy - Great British Spring Clean

A Resolution was passed at the 1954 WI AGM to start a national anti-litter campaign. The National Federation of WIs called a conference and the Keep Britain Tidy Group was formed in 1955. At first the new organisation was provided with office space at the NFWI Headquarters, though later it found its own premises. The Chairman of the Federation of the WI, Lady Brunner continued to be associated with The Keep Britain Tidy Group and was their first chairman. In 1964 she was appointed OBE 'for devotion to the group and her continual concern for its success since its inception' She was president of the Group for 19 years from 1966 and after that remained its senior Vice President. One of the rooms in the first Headquarters building was named after her.

In keeping with this initiative Kilham WI is planning to organise a community litter pick around the village and the surrounding roads but we need lots of volunteers.

So, join us, as we prepare to stand together and declare that litter pollution, including single-use plastic – which degrades the beauty of our environment and threatens to harm wildlife – is not acceptable.

The Old Star Kilham

The subject of a covetable Hockney sketch, East Street in the Yorkshire Wolds village of Kilham bears a passing resemblance to Genoa's "street of palaces". After the Old Manse, Pond House, Manor Farm and Hall Farm, you turn a corner into Church Street, where The Old Star faces the graveyard of All Saints. Behind a modest façade, you discover a surprisingly capacious pub that happily combines food and drink, a balancing act that defeats most boozers. A sympathetic refurb has enlarged one of the front rooms and let daylight in on the central bar where locals congregate.

There were about a dozen of us scattered around the pub on a Saturday lunchtime, warmed by wood fires and sipping pints of Theakston Best Bitter (3.8% ABV) or – hurray, my favourite – Timothy Taylor Landlord (4.3% ABV). A similar scene might have been observed any time in the past 270 years, judging by an indenture for the pub dated "The 11th day of December in the 20th year of the reign of our sovereign George II" (1747).

Just then the head chef Andrew emerged from the kitchen, hands claggy from pastry-making, "I'm doing 60-odd steak and ale pies for a shooting party. Trust me, when they come in at five o'clock you won't be able to hear yourself speak."

A county winner of last year's National Pub & Bar Awards, The Old Star is owned by the Savile family, who supply beef from their nearby farm. "Grown all of three miles away," said Andrew "and slaughtered by [local butcher] James White, who still has his own abattoir. All our beef is aged from 42 to 49 days."

Since a 12oz sirloin with five different trimmings (£21.50) was a bit hefty for lunchtime, we decided to share a bacon, brie and cranberry baguette with an excellent chopped salad and a great pile of chips.

The intoxicating quality of my pint was enhanced by the tipsy grave-stones across the road. How did they come to lean at such crazy angles? Surely not vandalism in such a posh spot. Whatever the cause, The Old Star is endowed with one of the most pleasing views of any pub I know.

The Annual Village Meeting will take place on Monday 8th April, in the village hall meeting room from 7pm. This is not a parish council meeting, it is a meeting for the residents of Kilham where you will have the opportunity to have your say regarding the village, questions, suggestions and comments on parish issues. This meeting will then be followed by the Parish Council meeting at 7.30pm.

Holderness Area Rural Transport or HART is a community bus service which any resident can call to reserve a seat to be taken to the shops or medical appointments. The parish council is aware of how important it is for these services to be maintained so residents do not become isolated or unable to attend appointments. This year a decision was taken to support the facility, one we will be reviewing each year. For further details of the HART service call 01964 536684.

The parish council last year received a grant from the Lisset Wind Farm Community fund to enable us to refurbish the Memorial Gardens on Middle Street.
