KILHAM NEWS October & November 2019

Community Speedwatch (CSW) is a national initiative where members of local communities join with the support of the Police to monitor speeds of vehicles using speed detection devices.

Vehicles exceeding the speed limit are referred to the Police with the aim of educating drivers to reduce their speeds. In cases where education is blatantly gnored and evidence of repeat or excessive offences is collated enforcement and prosecution follow.



CSW Online is working on behalf of the Police and communities to organise and coordinate CSW activity. Speeding is not just a local phenomenon - neither is Speedwatch.

Volunteers receive appropriate training, and are supported by neighbourhood policing team (NPT) staff. The scheme aims to cater for the problem of real or perceived speed related offending, and through partnership with the community it is to be used in circumstances that are necessary, justifiable and proportionate in order to:

- Reduce death and injury on the roads
- Improve the quality of life for local communities
- Reduce the speed of vehicles to the speed limit
- Increase public awareness of inappropriate speed

Speedwatch activity is not about interfering with neighbours' behaviour; it is a proactive solution to improve the safety and quality of life for everyone in the community. FRACKING/DRILLING IS STILL HAPPENING And not that far away...

Whilst the subject remains very quiet locally, if you are not aware, drilling for Oil/Gas is ongoing only 20 miles south of Kilham at West Newton. If they find anything, Rathlin Energy have permission to drill at least two more wells near Sproatley and Burton Constable Hall. The operator has PEDL permits (Petroleum Exploration and Development Licence) to extend their activities to 241,000 acres of East Yorkshire - this could easily be us next along with the rest of the local area! Large quantities of Hy-drochloric Acid are being pumped down to dissolve the rocks to release any oil and gas to ascertain viability. This would be repeated many times over if operations are expanded. The drill pipe goes through our underground water supplies... Any damage to this would no doubt have disastrous effects for us all...

Please think about what is being done. Are you happy with the potential effects of such industrialisation of our countryside?
