A whole year of Epic Cycling

I started my challenge at 67 years old on 26th Feb 2021 the first anniversary of my beautiful niece Zara taking her own life.

On 22nd May I attempted to complete the Everest Challenge 29,045ft climbing & 175 miles in one day on one hill. Unfortunately, gale force wind and horizontal rain forced me to stop after completing 150 miles & 25,000ft climbing in 18 hours of cycling.

My second challenge started on Friday 25th June at 2000 hours, with my two friends Josh Watson (29yrs old), and Andy Macrae (46yrs old), all members of the Porkshire Cycle Club which is a Strava club where we welcome all riders. We had a nice back wind down to the Humber Bridge where we were supplied with plenty of hot drinks & snacks.







We then had 100 miles to Spalding unsupported but 20 miles further on near Caistor, Julie who is a member of our club had driven an hour from her home with a feast fit for a king with lovely sandwiches and 2 fantastic different cakes plus hot drinks. It was a surprise for me and I had a grin like a Cheshire cat for ages after. The wind dropped to nothing during the night and we soldiered on and arrived in Spalding at 6am, where we were cooked sausage sandwiches which were just what the doctor ordered. It was very emotional cycling past the place where I had last been for a meal with my niece in Sutterton. It was also where we had the wake, and then we went passed the Crematorium. It was also emotional seeing all of them for the first time since the funeral, but I had to keep focused as we had 115 miles still to cycle.

Our support vehicle driver, Mark from our club arrived while we were in Spalding, so we were able to put on clean clothes! Our journey back was into a block head wind all the way which made it much harder, but with Mark stopping regularly, we had plenty of refreshments along the way which was a great help.

We had one person from our club meet us 20 miles south of the Humber bridge and 4 others met us at the bridge which spurred us on to complete our challenge in sunshine for the last 2 hours, and we all finished feeling strong.

We cycled 230miles averaging 15 miles per hour, we cycled for 15 hours and total time with stops was 22 hours from start to finish.

My next challenge starts on Friday 30th July my 68th birthday where I am attempting to cycle 300 miles in one day, on a 15-mile circuit from my home.

The photos were hilarious with some props. Many of the photos were photobombed by Robin. Our silent disco, which was silent because of the headphones muffling the music but wasn't very silent because everybody was singing-including teachers! Near the end, we had some pizza for tea and a memories campfire with smores - it was amazing!!! Then it was time to sleep. As we fell asleep, it was silent.

As I write we are still awaiting full guidance on fully re-opening our church buildings: however here is an extract (received today) from the latest guidance from the Bishop of Hull, Whitby and Selby

Dear Friends

It has been said many times that the last 17 months have been a time like no other, for the Church as well as society at large. With people across the Diocese and beyond, you have worked wonders in ensuring that there has been pastoral care, community engagement, and that our church buildings have been safe and welcoming for worship. All this has been costly to you and your local colleagues, in time and effort, and in its emotional demands too. We recognise that alongside the discovery of new ways of working — online worship being the prime example — there have been new and radical questions about the future shape of Church life: and amid that, the value of ministry faithfully carried out in the context of parishes and chaplaincies has been incalculable. We cannot thank you enough for all that you have done.

From 19 July

In many ways, the Government's announcement that virtually all Covid restrictions will be lifted on Monday 19 July is welcome. At the same time, it is important to recognise that some people are still vulnerable, and many still anxious.

You will find advice about recommended practice on the Church of England website at www.churchofengland.org/coronavirus and we will continue to circulate guidance via email and *The Journal*. Within the last hour we have received new national advice, a copy of which is attached to this email for ease (Glyn can supply this!) We are still awaiting updated government guidance but we will send out further updates as further information is shared with us.

In following the guidance, please bear the principle in mind — and encourage others too — that we 'bear one another's burdens, and so fulfil the law of Christ' (Galatians 6.2),

and must not allow our own liberty to be the cause of other's stumbling (1 Corinthians 8.9; Romans 14.21). In other words, whilst there will now be fewer hard and fast rules, it will be a loving service to others if, for the time being, we find ways to act more cautiously than might suit our own personal convenience and preferences.

Speedwatch Newsletter

We begin this report by welcoming three new recruits to the Kilham Speedwatch team. The new members received their training on 12 July from Humberside Police and are now fully trained and raring to carry out the monitoring of traffic within the village. If you would like to join the team and are



able to give a minimum of two hours per month, please contact the co-ordinator, Gerry Horner on kilhamcsw@gmail.com. You will be made very welcome.

Since our last report the team have carried out further monitoring within the village and although the number of vehicles reported as exceeding the limit remains higher than we would like, the data shows a noticeable reduction, which is encouraging. However, we must not be complacent, instead let's encourage safe driving and keep our village roads safe.

In the three months April, May, June, the records show:

April, 748 vehicles monitored, 17 reported as speeding.

May, 919 vehicles monitored, 12 reported as speeding.

June, 938 vehicles monitored, 38 reported as speeding.

A number of people have raised their concerns with the teams and asked whether we can monitor traffic in other areas of the village. Sadly, after seeking advice from the Police it will not be possible. This is because we are governed by where they have carried out a risk assessment and given their approval for Speedwatch activity. Areas where there are no proper footpaths for the team to stand on, are deemed unsafe and therefore unusable for the purpose of Speedwatch. That said, it does not mean that individuals cannot raise their own concerns with the Police and they actively encourage you to do so. If you have a specific concern about a vehicle then it would help the Police if you can supply a registration number, vehicle colour, date, time and location.

Finally, the team would like to thank all those who stop to say hello and show their support and to those who wave or give thumbs up as they pass. It's very much appreciated, so please continue to show your support.

After making contact with the school regarding the issues of speeding, the Head Teacher and teacher responsible for the Eco Warrior group have said they would like to join a team next term and show the children what we do and why.

This is a positive move forward and hopefully we gain more support from our community and the children get to enjoy the experience and encourage their families to drive safely.



In June Jim Stebbings took us to The Topsy - Turvey World of Gilbert and Sullivan. The computer club has started again in the large room behind the Star from 1pm on Friday afternoons. This is for everyone from complete beginners to those with a specific query. Gerry is usually able to sort out any problems but we all help each other when we can.

Dog Fouling

There appears to be a growing spate of dog fouling throughout the village. Whilst most dog owners are responsible, community minded people, there are some who think they can exercise their dogs, both on and off lead wherever they see fit, leaving behind a trail of dog excreta for other people to tread in and, on occasion, clean up after them! There have been a few occasions, of late, where people have been observed in the church yard and village hall grounds and also on the Kilham Village playing fields, exercising their dogs. These areas are not provided for the convenience of irresponsible dog owners, even if they do appear to be centrally placed in the village and convenient for their dog's ablutions. In the case of the church yard, this behaviour is disrespectful and, in all areas, downright anti-social. Our children play on the grassy area attached to the village hall and it has taken years of hard work and fund raising by the Playing Fields Association to provide a dedicated, safe place on Back Lane where the youngsters of the village can enjoy themselves. The grass cutter at the church and village hall also has to endure the by-products of this disgusting behaviour whilst carrying out his duties. Dog fouling is an offence which is subject to a Fixed Penalty Fine of £80 or up to £1000 if it goes to court!

Surely, we can all accept responsibility for our own pets and ensure that they are exercised away from these areas, preferably on a lead, to prevent this blight on our neighbourhood from getting any worse? Before you take your dog out next time, ask yourself the question,

'Would I like my children to come home covered in dog muck and risk catching disease because someone refuses to take responsibility for their pet' At the very least, pickup after your dog and dispose of the waste responsibly. It's no good hanging the 'poo bags' on trees like Christmas decorations or throwing them in the hedge bottom! I daresay there are some who couldn't give a damn and will continue with this anti-social behaviour but it is hoped that many will have a conscience and take heed of the above.
