It is with great sadness that we had to say goodbye to Pete Boyes, who died unexpectedly on Friday 15th October. Pete, who lived in Kilham all his life, passed away at Castle Hill Hospital in Cottingham, aged 72, after suffering heart failure.

Pete had been involved in the family business, G Boyes Garage in Chapel Lane, Kilham - which was established by his father George - for more than 50 years.

His son Cameron said: "We have been so overwhelmed with everyone's kindness and would like to pass on our thanks for the many messages of support since my dad passed away unexpectedly."

"We would also like to place on record our gratitude to the staff at Castle Hill Hospital for everything they did to try and save his life."

It will be business as usual for G Boyes Garage which will continue to operate with Simon Rhodes as the manager.

Pete's funeral was held on Friday 5th November, at 1.15pm at Kilham Church and was attended by so many friends and neighbours that there wasn't room for everyone in the church, and many people lining the streets to pay their respects.

All our love and thoughts are with his wife Pam, son Cameron and daughterin-law Louise, daughter Heidi-Jayne, grandchildren Sam and Lottie. He will be missed greatly by the whole village.

* The Kilham 10k returned with 250 entrants and 50 entering the inaugural 1k fun run. Kindly sponsored by Bee Health, The Old Star, West Hale Gate Glamping and Raleigh Seeds Ltd we raised £2350. Thank you to those that participated either by running, volunteering, or spectating, it received fantastic feedback and we look forward to its return next year.

* The Bonfire and Fireworks Display exceeded all expectations in terms of numbers attending. The weather was kind, and the display was amazing from Ronnie Tate and the local team of firers. Kindly sponsored by Lillys Plumbing, Simon Baker Joinery, Little Rascals, G Boyes, The Old Star and a generous donation from Alan Pattison. Although figures are not yet finalised, we estimate it will have raised approx. £4500 which breaks all records several times over for this event. * Football goal posts have also been reinstated so we have a full-size football pitch once again. Works were carried out by Kentworx, who also installed our new bike rack. This now completes the initial plan for the pump track.

News from Kilham School

Dear Villagers,

Despite the ongoing challenges of Covid 19 the school and the children continue to flourish. On Thursday 11th November children from Year Six, staff and the chair of governors, Mr Buckle joined in the annual Remembrance Service at the war memorial outside of All Saints Church Kilham. During lesson times, the children have learnt about the lives of soldiers from the Kilham area who died in WW1 and WW2.

At school the children completed some emotive artwork using charcoal. All of the chil-dren wrote Remembrance prayers which are now on display inside the church. As part of their work pupils wrote the names of all of the soldiers from Kilham on crosses which were presented and planted at the foot of the war memorial during the service. Many members of the local community were in attendance and joined in the 2-minute silence to remember the sacrifice of all of the soldiers who lost their lives. The service was led by Reverend Glynn Owen who finished it with a thought provoking prayer. Well done to Olivia Smallwood whose prayer was chosen by Ms Hobson to go in the centre of the wreath, which is now in place at the memorial.

Local History Project

Children across the school have been in a history fever this week, which culminated in a local history day around the village. Children from the school were out in the village learning about the history of the local church and some of the graves in the churchyard. Other groups from the school were looking at the history of the old mill on Millside Road. Finally as part of our Remembrance service our Year 6 children were finding out about all of the WW1 and WW2 soldiers who are named on the Remembrance cross outside the church.

The Year 6 group have also used charcoal to produce some emotive artwork and Remem-brance prayers which are now on display inside All Saints Church. If you get a chance please call in and have a look.

Thank you to all of the parents who have spent time working with their children to dig WW1 or WW2 artefacts and photographs out of the loft. Many of the children have shared this information in a show and tell session with their classmates and all of the artefacts are now on display in classrooms.





In October Bryan Woodward spoke to us about his work in the prison service. And in November Sue Dawson told us about Carnaby Airfield during WWII and the background of the memorial you see as you drive into Carnaby. Both were extremely enjoyable and informative

meetings. Anne's guided walk round the centre of the village was very well attended and we look forward to the next episode. Several ladies went to the Federation Annual Meeting at Tickton Grange, a new venue which was much admired. We have welcomed five more members and had several visitors this year. Kilham Speedwatch

Kilham is a Community Speedwatch Village.

Speedwatch is a proactive initiative aimed at improving the quality of life and safety for everyone in the community. Unfortunately, there are a few members of our community and surrounding areas who think it is acceptable to speed through the village and ignore



the speed limits. Their dangerous actions do little to protect the safety of our community and animals, which is why a number of volunteers have been trained by the Police to monitor and report drivers exceeding the speed limits.

Although there have been a few negative comments made on social media about the Speedwatch initiative, it is refreshing to know that we do get support from quite a few drivers who see the teams monitoring traffic with many stopping to say thank you for the job we are doing.

A good session for us is if we record no speeding motorists. A bad day is when we have no alternative but to record and report speeding motorists.

Vehicles monitored and reported for exceeding 30MPH 2020		
Vehicles recorded 4534 Speeding 325	Average 7.96% Speedwatch monitoring time 47 hours	
Vehicles recorded 7867 Speeding 306	2021 Average 3.84% Speedwatch monitoring time 65.5 hours	

Whilst we have recorded 3333 more vehicles in 2021, there were 19 less speeding vehicles. This is a drop of 4.12% from last year.

Repeat Offenders

To date there have been four repeat offenders reported to Police with two drivers monitored at 37mph, one driver monitored at 39mph and one driver recorded as 55mph, 25mph over the permitted speed limit.

Highest Recorded Speed

Not a record to be proud of, but one driver was monitored at 64mph whilst approaching the school, which was clearly displaying the school flashing sign of 20mph.

Maybe those in the minority who don't support Speedwatch can now understand the need and at least accept the realisation that some drivers are behaving in an unacceptable way.

New Volunteers

All new volunteers will be trained by a suitably Police-approved trainer. All new volunteers will sign an indemnity confirming that they have received an initial health and safety briefing before they are allowed to participate in Speed Watch activity.

Thank you to the vast majority of the Kilham community for the support and safe driving.
