Non-uniform

Well done to all of the children and families from Kilham Church of England Primary School who joined in our non-uniform day before half term which was in red, green and black, the colours

The school received £220.00 in donations which buy 5 new stoves for families in Malawi. Thank you so much for your support and generosity.

Harvest collection.

During our work linked to our Harvest Festival, staff from the school delivered all of the products that you had donated as part of our Harvest collection to the Foodbank in Driffield. As a school we collected over 234KG of tins and dried foods which is the average weight of an ox. We are currently running the Food Bank out of the Rix Pavillion on the Driffield Showground and have been tasked by the East Riding of Yorkshire Council with preparing three Emergency Boxes (otherwise known as Boris Boxes) for each of 21 local parishes in case of a further lockdown or other emergency due to flooding, snow etc.

The boxes are intended to supply, free of charge, any person who is forced to self-isolate or shield and has no other means of obtaining groceries. The food is all ambient, should provide food for a few days, and does not require any specialist storage but owing to space we will no longer able to store these on your behalf.

These boxes are being stored at The Poplars, Kilham until needed. If you or someone you know needs this kind of support—

The food bank in Driffield is endeavouring to stay open during this crisis and bring food to those that can't access it or are struggling for any other reason.

They are giving out generic bags but offer extras like nappies, sanitary products and toiletries. You need to let them know you are coming if you plan to visit—contact 07445554006—They help anyone in isolation, alone and unable to get out.
