Kilham School news: Exciting outdoor area.

Over the summer we have developed a new outdoor den building and construction area for the older children in classes 3,4 and 5. Unlike other play areas within the school this area is not a sanitised play area. The children will be using old wooden pallets, planks, tyres, wooden logs and other materials to help them create dens, bridges, obstacle courses and shelters. The area they are in has a few nettles and a few spiky bushes—which we have not removed on purpose. The key vision behind this area is that children can be children and learn to manage and take some small risks, as we did when we were children.

"Research by Mariana Brussoni led to interviews with hundreds of children, one factor stood out: the freedom to build on imagination. In the typical United Kingdom playground, equipment is fixed and the options for play are limited; there is only so much you can do with a slide, monkey bars or swings.

Instead, Brussoni's team recommends removing all this structure, and instead providing loose materials such as logs, mud, tarps, crates, sticks, planks, ropes and even water to play with.

However the most important element in any play space is, again, the psychological and physical space to take risks."

We do expect a few splinters, bumps and bruises during the time our children are using this area. We have written a risk assessment, set some basic rules and will keep a close eye on how things develop.

The whole ethos and vision for this area links with the free flow experience our children have in nursery and reception. The new area will now continue elements of that approach as children get older.

Kilham Speedwatch October 2021

Since our last report the team have carried out further monitoring within the village and although the number of vehicles reported as exceeding the limit remains higher than we would like, the data shows a noticeable reduction, which is encouraging. However, we must not be complacent, instead let's encourage safe driving and keep our village roads safe.

KCSW would like to welcome three new volunteers who have completed the police training and are raring to go.

In the months July and August, the records show: July, 1701 vehicles monitored, 85 reported as speeding. August, 1470 vehicles monitored, 69 reported as speeding.

A number of people have raised their concerns with the teams and asked whether we can monitor traffic in other areas of the village. Sadly, after seeking advice from the Police it will not be possible. This is because we are governed by where they have carried out a risk assessment and given their approval for Speedwatch activity. Areas where there are no proper footpaths for the team to stand on, are deemed unsafe and therefore unusable for the purpose of Speedwatch. That said, it does not mean that individuals cannot raise their own concerns with the Police and they actively encourage you to do so. If you have a specific concern about a vehicle then it would help the Police if you can supply a registration number, vehicle colour, date, time and location.

Finally, the team would like to thank all those who stop to say hello and show their support and to those who wave or give thumbs up as they pass. It's very much appreciated, so please continue to show your support.
