Willy Howe - Is it a person, a bird or is it a plane? Well, actually, not many people know this but it is a Neolithic burial mound and one of the largest of its type in East Yorkshire. It is located between the villages of Burton Fleming and Wold Newton and, according to English Heritage, it extends to 50 metres by 40 metres. It is also



surrounded by superstition and tales including much merry making by fairies. It is sited near the flying field home of Willy Howe Model Flying Club, who are a small friendly club affiliated to the British Model Flying Association. The club fly a wide variety of fixed wing aircraft and also helicopters and drones. Since the unfortunate events involving drone flying in the airspace of commercial aircraft, the sport is now tightly regulated by the Civil Aviation Authority and flyers of all types of model weighing 250g or above must now be registered with the CAA and their models clearly marked with a unique reference number which identifies the plane's owner.

This year is a significant one for the BMFA as they are celebrating their Centenary and have a number of events planned to celebrate this milestone. One such event is a Guinness World Record attempt for the greatest number of flyers in the air simultaneously. The Club intends to support the record attempt along with many other clubs Nationally when at 12.00 on Sunday 15th May, a number of craft will be in the air and the event recorded. Only BMFA registered flyers are allowed to participate and our part in the record attempt will take place at the Willy Howe flying field.

In addition, Club members will be supporting the Easter Weekend event at the Yorkshire Air Museum at Elvington airfield and promoting the Club and the hobby to a wider audience.

Whilst the final plans are still being formulated, the Club would hope to promote itself at any appropriate local events, including those run by the Kilham Playing Field Association, which it has done successfully in the past with Club members available to show off models and answer questions with the hope of gaining the attention of younger, potential new members.We hope to be able to publish more details of further planned events in the next newsletter, but if you have any enquiries in the meantime, please feel to contact the Club Secretary, lan Maggs, using the club's email WHMFC@hotmail.co.uk Also, if you would like to arrange to get a feel for flying a radio controlled model at our flying field, please use the same email contact and we will select a weather window and arrange a time to suit both parties.
