Whether that be - What events we put on?

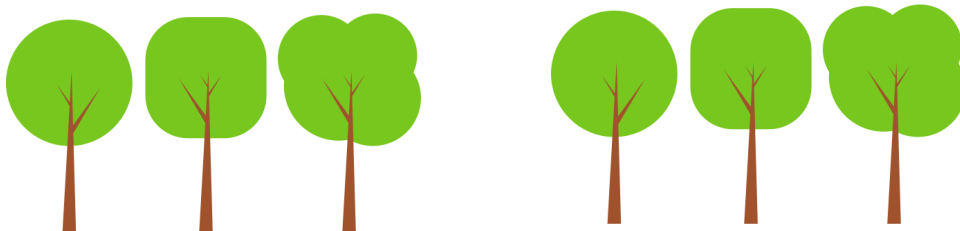
Who is responsible for delivering the plans?

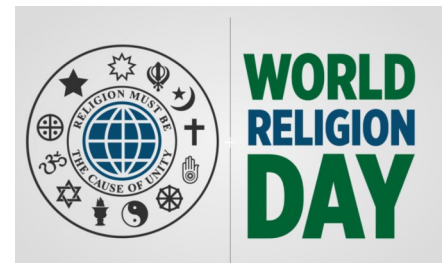

## News from Kilham School

This week has been the most challenging week in school due to a significant rise in the number of positive Covid 19 Omicron cases in the school, especially in classes 3 and class 6. In a recent Public Health Briefing headteachers across the East Riding of Yorkshire were told to expect the next two to three weeks to be especially challenging because:

Cases in East Yorkshire have risen from 250 cases a day to over 1000 cases a day. The Omicron variant is highly infectious and highly active in the local area but causes less illness especially amongst fully vaccinated adults and younger children. Families from different areas of the country have mixed over the Christmas holidays.

Despite all of the challenges, the children have been learning about World Religion Day which happened on Sunday January 16th. The aim of World Religion Day is to promote understanding and peace between all religions and to encourage people to learn about other faiths and their followers.



As part of this work children were set a research challenge to find out some information about a less well-

known religion. Many children across the school bought in information about "Shinto".

During the week one of our worships looked at this popular religion which is mainly based in Japan

### **What is Shinto?**

Shinto is the ancient religion of Japan, practised by approximately 100 million people across the country. Shinto means 'the way of the gods' and is viewed as a way of life to the people of Japan.

Shinto differs from other major world religions because it does not have a holy book or text and is not based on a founder. The central tenant of Shinto is a collection of rituals that are believed to allow humans to communicate and feel closer to the 'Kami' - a series of spirits which represent the natural world.

Shinto teaches that human beings are fundamentally good but can be made to do bad things by 'evil spirits'.

These spirits can exist in trees, animals, mountains, rivers, human creations such as cups or musical instruments, and even in people. Within the Shinto religion, these spiritual powers are called Kami.

Followers of Shinto believe the Kami will bring many positive benefits when they are worshipped properly, such as: Health, Business success, Relationship success & Good exam results
