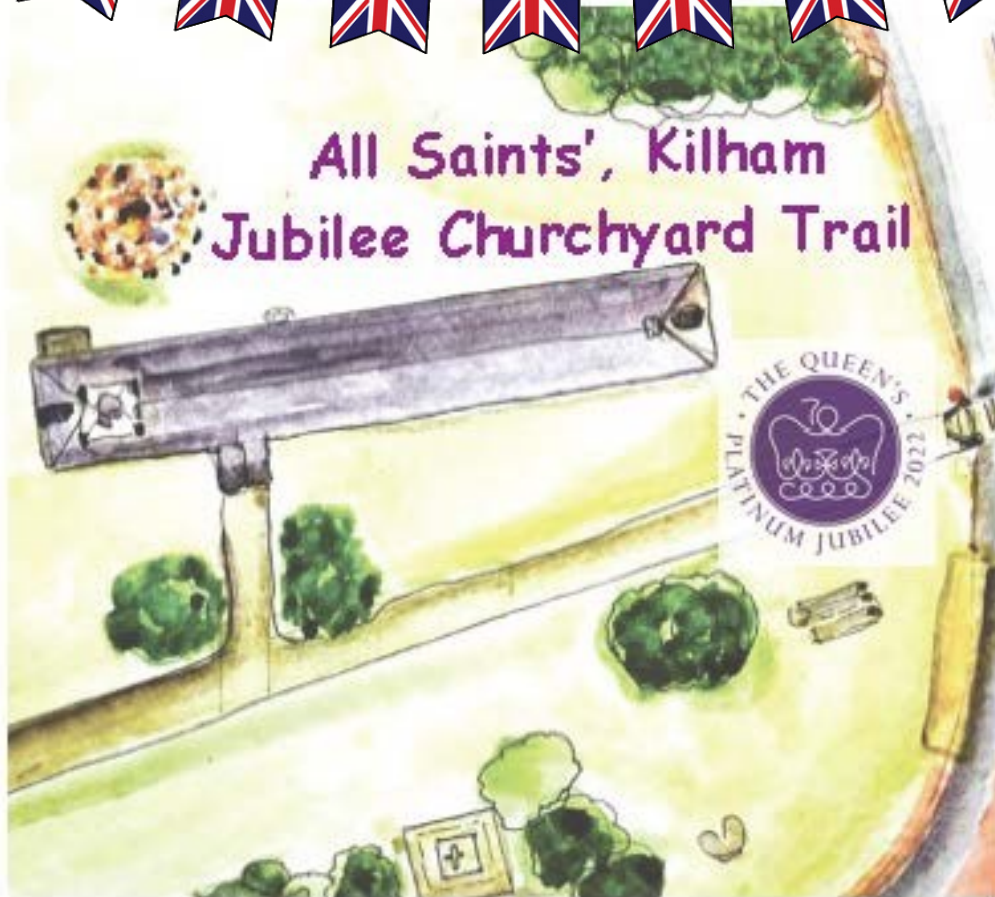

News from Kilham School

The school is working hard to support children who have been affected by the pandemic. Across the school, we run after school booster sessions targeting children who need to catch up. As part of this work, we have several volunteers who work across school reading with key children.

Recent Changes:

Updated computing equipment to help deliver our new Teach Computing Units.

DFE funded fibre cable scheme to improve our internet provision.

The school is working to establish a closer working relationship with the Kilham Playgroup to encourage local families to come to Kilham School.

The school has recently updated our phonics scheme this is why we teach reading through *Little Wandle Letters and Sounds Revised*, a systematic and synthetic phonics programme. This is supporting young readers across the school.

The school has received one child who is part of a Ukrainian family living with their hosts in Langtoft, we are working with other local schools and the local authority to provide support and a high level of education.

As part of Earth Day 2022 several children volunteered to pick litter up from outside the school and along Millside – they collected two large bags of rubbish.

The school is offering after school clubs in the summer term, which include archery, gymnastics and gardening.

I am very proud of the education we have provided for the pupils of Kilham School during the pandemic. With restrictions relaxing and the world opening up we are aiming to re-connect with each other and the local community.

We have just finished for the half term and the children celebrated the last day with a Queen's Platinum Jubilee garden party! All the children dressed up smartly with parents, grandparents and carers also dressing up in their finest as we were honoured to have a special guest! Mrs Smith looked like true royalty with her wonderful crown, and white gloves. The sun shone for us and everybody sang 'God Save the Queen' - some of the boys very enthusiastically indeed.

Soon the pea harvest season will be upon us and later on the cereal crop harvest, just a reminder that there will be large agricultural vehicles passing through the village to access the fields. Kilham is a beautiful rural village that has kept its agricultural industry but with the expansion of housing more vehicles are being parked on the highway. I am sure you are all well aware of the size of the agricultural vehicles, which over the years have grown in size but farming life is part and parcel of living in Kilham. We ask that when parking you are considerate not only to others but that large vehicles are still able to pass along the highway. From the 31st May parking enforcement will be passed over from the police's responsibility to ERYC, should you be found to be blocking a pavement, access or verges there could be a fine of £70 issued. We have been very fortunate as the police have been more likely to have a "quiet word" but if ERYC are called, they will issue a fine.

KILHAM COMMUNITY SPEEDWATCH

This is the third year that Kilham Community Speedwatch has been in operation. It would be nice if we could recruit a few more volunteers, but the volunteers that we have do an excellent job. Volunteers receive appropriate training by the police, and are supported by the neighbourhood policing team (NPT) staff.



Vehicles exceeding the speed limit are referred to the Police with the aim of educating drivers to reduce their speeds. In cases where education is blatantly ignored and evidence of repeat or excessive offences is collated (even across county borders), enforcement and prosecution follow.

In 2020 the team recorded 4534 vehicles of which 325 were speeders. Overall average was 7.96%

In 2021 the team recorded 7867 vehicles of which 306 were speeders. Overall average was 3.89%

In 2022 in the first 3 months, the team have recorded 444 vehicles of which 35 were speeders. Overall average so far is 7.33%

For the period between 2020 and 2021, the figures show that even though there was an increase in the number of vehicles counted, the number of speeders decreased.

Unfortunately, that can't be said for the period between Feb and April this year.

Speedwatch activity is not about interfering with neighbours' behaviour; it is a proactive solution to improve the safety and quality of life for everyone in the community.

THE KILHAM COMPUTER CLUB

The first meeting took place in the back room of the Old Star Pub on the 24th March 2017.

It has now been five years since we started and we have helped quite a few people not only with problems with their computers, but also showing them how to access the internet, setup email accounts, produce leaflets, start their family trees, organise and edit photos, setup mail merge and book air travel and lots more.

Lucy Savile very kindly still lets us use the room free of charge.

Even though the attendance has dropped over the years, there are still people who attend regularly. We have had some new people attend over the past few months and it has been a busy time for Christine who was able to help a lady trace members of her family. We also had a young man called Lewis who is a student at East Riding College doing 15 weeks work experience for his degree. He was very shy to begin with but soon got over that. He was well liked and very helpful to the people who came. In fact, some people still ask for him. He is also helping with a WI presentation.

We are a local not for profit group. Our aim is purely to bring people of all ages and abilities together. Anyone can join, we have members who live outside Kilham.

PARKING ISSUES

On Friday 6th May 2022, the residents of Garden Cottages were invited to attend a meeting at the Village Hall to discuss parking issues with Belinda Welburn (Together Housing), a member of the Parish Council and 2 Police officers.

This was in regard to residents parking across the pavement area down South Side. These issues had been reported by the Neighbourhood Watch group. Belinda Welburn has spoken to the police to say that she thinks there are other issues here, in particular, residents with cars are wary of parking their cars on the main road for fear of being hit by tractors and other vehicles. A couple of cars already have had their wing mirrors broken. The police have acknowledged the comments Belinda has made but have stressed that action will be taken against those people who park across the pavement area.

The police have said that the residents can park legally on the main road on South Side as there are no restrictions (yellow lines). They also mentioned that small commercial vehicles were also allowed to park legally on the main road. Most of the residents park their cars in their driveways, but because there is limited space, part of front or back of the cars can protrude slightly over the pavement but not enough to hinder people with prams or wheelchairs who are using the footpath.

As from 31st May 2022, any parking issues will no longer be handled by the police. East Riding of Yorkshire Council parking officers will take over this duty from that date and you may see them patrolling the village. You can report any illegal parking to the ERYC and a parking officer will be sent to investigate. If they find that the vehicle is illegally parked, a £70 fine will be issued which will be recognised by the courts. This is nationwide policy.

The grass verge across the road from Garden Cottages could be used as a parking area. This was brought to the attention of the Parish Council at the meeting on Monday 9th May. Since the land belongs to the ERYC permission would be needed.

Willy Howe Model Flying Club World Record Attempt- 15th May 2022

“Sunday 15th May saw Willy Howe Model Flying Club take part in a Guinness World Record Attempt organised by the British Model Flying Association as part of their centenary celebrations. The Record attempt, which involved over 200 Clubs Nationally, aimed to have the most craft in the air flying at 12 Noon. The day was a great success and the BMFA are currently collating the results from across the UK. Once the BMFA has the final figure they'll be forwarded to the FAI and Guinness for ratification and hopefully recognise it as a new world record.

The event was coordinated by the Club's Competition Secretary Ian Payne, who had the difficult task of getting all 13 aircraft safely in the air and by the noon deadline and back on the ground before batteries or fuel were exhausted.

A team photograph confirmed all Members who participated and the weather conditions on the day were quite challenging with a blustery wind blowing across the runway.

Club Chairman, Ian Howard, gave thanks to the excellent event coordination by Ian Payne in making the attempt a great success with all 13 flyers in the air simultaneously at noon. He went on to comment “ Ian Payne did a fantastic job in coordination the logistics for the record attempt with the last plane, piloted by Kevin Potts, landing exactly 10 minutes after take-off as planned. Congratulations to the flying skills of all Members concerned.”
