KILHAM DEVELOPMENT & DRAINAGE INFRASTRUCTURE SURVEY JULY 2024

Developers are proposing 41 houses on Clackna Farm site (ex Websters) on East Street, Kilham

The site is mostly in a conservation area and most of it falls into countryside land, and is close to the very rare chalk stream.

Kilham has had significant sewage and flood issues for several years. This year in particular saw sewage & general floods plus around 18 weeks of tankers leading excess water away day & night.

Recently built & proposed housing, (incl this development) will add 134 houses to those occupied when outline planning was approved in 2019. That extra development adds to the load on the existing village drainage infrastructure.


