

Every Thursday at 10.30am, in church, at All Saints, Kilham, come and join in for a time of prayer and discussion over a cuppa and biscuits all welcome.


We will continue to have a 'Zoom' service on the first and third Sundays of the month at 11am and weekly each Wednesday at 10am.

# Branwell's Flute and Hardy's Hornpipe

# Saturday 22<sup>nd</sup> June 2.30pm Kilham Village Hall

Peter Harrison, playing an historic flute, explores the music collections of Branwell Brontë and Thomas Hardy

Branwell Brontë (1817-1848) and Thomas Hardy (1840-1928) were keenly interested in, and influenced by, music. Branwell played the flute and kept a notebook of his favourite tunes arranged for the instrument. Hardy was born into a musical family and he inherited his father's and grandfather's handwritten collections of traditional tunes. In boyhood he learned to play the violin and joined his father in the local village band.

Peter Harrison is director of the early music ensemble *Concert Royal*. His 1790 boxwood flute is of the kind played by Branwell and is perfectly suited to the country

music so loved by Thomas Hardy.

Presenter Julia Elliott joins Peter in this exploration in words and music of this fascinating musical world. There are two 30-minute sections with a short refreshment break.
