A big thankyou to all who took part in the recent survey of current use and a wish list for additions to our playing field. We had 60 responses and the survey showed us frequency & length of visits, equipment/facilities used and most importantly for us—the list of things that you want us to improve.

The highest request was for toilet facilities and this year we have managed to fund keeping the Portaloo on site from late Spring until now. It will be removed later this month and then brought back again next year,

The next highest request was for additional sheltered area. We are pleased to announce that with the funding we have managed to raise—we have ordered a new 10 meter shelter—similar to the one already on site. This is due to be installed in the Spring along with additional seating/picnic tables.

More play equipment was next most requested from the survey —and again—we have recently finished installation of lots of new play equipment and some of the much loved older pieces are being refurbished. Our play provision is certainly one of the best in the area now, and one that we can be very proud of working together to create and maintain.

More sports facilities, improving the bike track and entrance gate area and having a peaceful and sensory seating area are all things we would like to look at for the future. 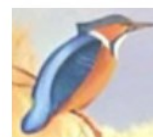

News From Kilham School

Over the last year, our school has completed a comprehensive review of our Design Technology and STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering and Maths) curriculum. This review has looked at providing staff with the latest DT training, an investment in resources, and the coverage and progression within the subject our children receive as they move from EYFS to Year 6.

Kilham School is also the lead school of the fourteen-school Driffield Enthuse Partnership, accessing funding from the Dogger Bank Windfarm STEM Project.

The Driffield Enthuse Partnership is working together to support significant improvements in staff training, knowledge and skills and increase the number of creative opportunities to introduce our children to STEM subjects and jobs in STEM-based industries.

All of this work is now starting to make an impact, and over the last two weeks, children have been involved in two full days of DT work, much of it closely linked to their topics.

Year 5 and 6 – Moving Mechanisms

This project teaches children about pneumatic systems. They experiment with pneumatics before designing, making and evaluating a pneumatic machine that performs a useful function.

Years 3 and 4 Cook Well, Eatwell

This project teaches children about food groups and the Eatwell guide. They learn about methods of cooking and explore these by cooking potatoes and ratatouille. The children choose and make a taco filling according to specific design criteria.

Year 1 and 2—Remarkable Recipes

This project teaches children about sources of food and tools used for food preparation. They also discover why some foods are cooked and learn to read a simple recipe. The children made a lovely spaghetti Bolognese and they have really enjoyed the hands-on aspect of the work.

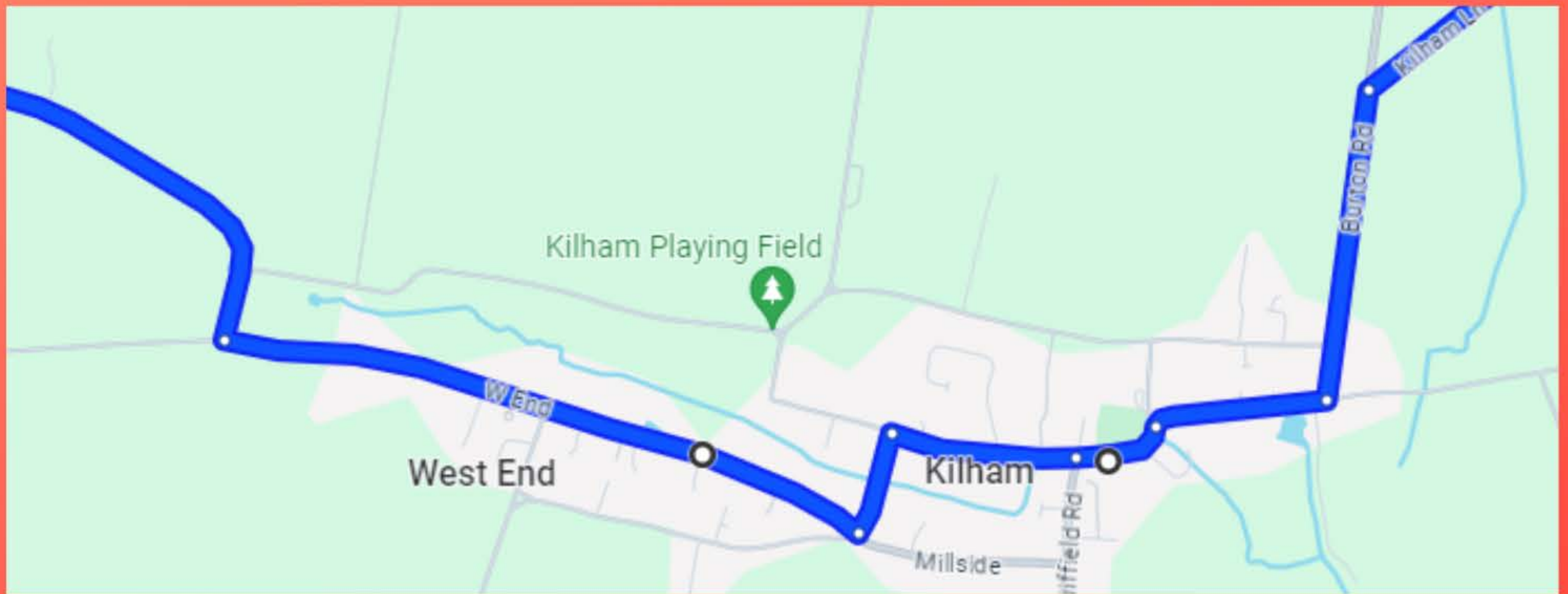
