#### News from the School—Kilham Pupils Mark 80th VE Day Anniversary in Style



On Thursday 8th May, children at Kilham C of E Primary School proudly joined in the 80th anniversary celebrations of VE Day, commemorating the end of World War II in Europe. The school was transformed with red, white, and blue bunting and flags, as pupils enthusiastically helped decorate classrooms and corridors in patriotic colours.

The day began with a whole school worship, where children learned about the significance

of Victory in Europe Day and the national celebrations that took place on 8th May 1945. Pupils discovered how Prime Minister Winston Churchill addressed the nation, announcing the end of the war and thanking the British people for their courage and sacrifice.

Classroom activities included listening to video about a VE day veteran and learning about how people across the country celebrated the long-awaited peace. Children also learned about the late Queen Elizabeth II—then Princess Elizabeth—who, along with her sister Princess Margaret, secretly joined the crowds celebrating in London on VE Day, a moment she later described as "one of the most memorable nights of my life."

The day was both educational and moving, helping children reflect on the importance of peace, resilience, and remembrance.



#### **KILHAM PARISH COUNCIL**

The Parish Council was sorry to hear of the loss of Andy Oxley. A dedicated parish councillor and valued member of the Kilham Playing Fields Association. Andy joined the Parish Council in 2018 and served as Vice Chairman. He worked tirelessly and quietly for the good of the village and will be deeply missed by all who knew him. We extend our heartfelt condolences to Andy's family and friends.

Kilham Playing Fields continues to thrive, offering a well-used facility for both village residents and those from surrounding areas. We kindly ask that visitors take their litter home, as the bins are frequently overflowing. Volunteers work hard to keep the area clean and enjoyable for everyone. The Parish Council is currently working with East Riding of Yorkshire Council (ERYC) to request a larger bin, and your cooperation in the meantime would be greatly appreciated.

This May, the Parish Council held its Annual Meeting. Christine Snowden was reelected as Chairman, and Lucy Savile as Vice Chairman. The Council remains focused on addressing the issue of speeding through the village. As part of this effort, we are applying for funding from the Lissett Windfarm Grant to install Village Gateways at all four entrances to Kilham. These features help alert drivers that they are entering a residential area.

We also discussed the idea of placing 30mph speed stickers on household bins. If you believe this could help raise awareness and reduce speeding, these stickers can be easily purchased online.
